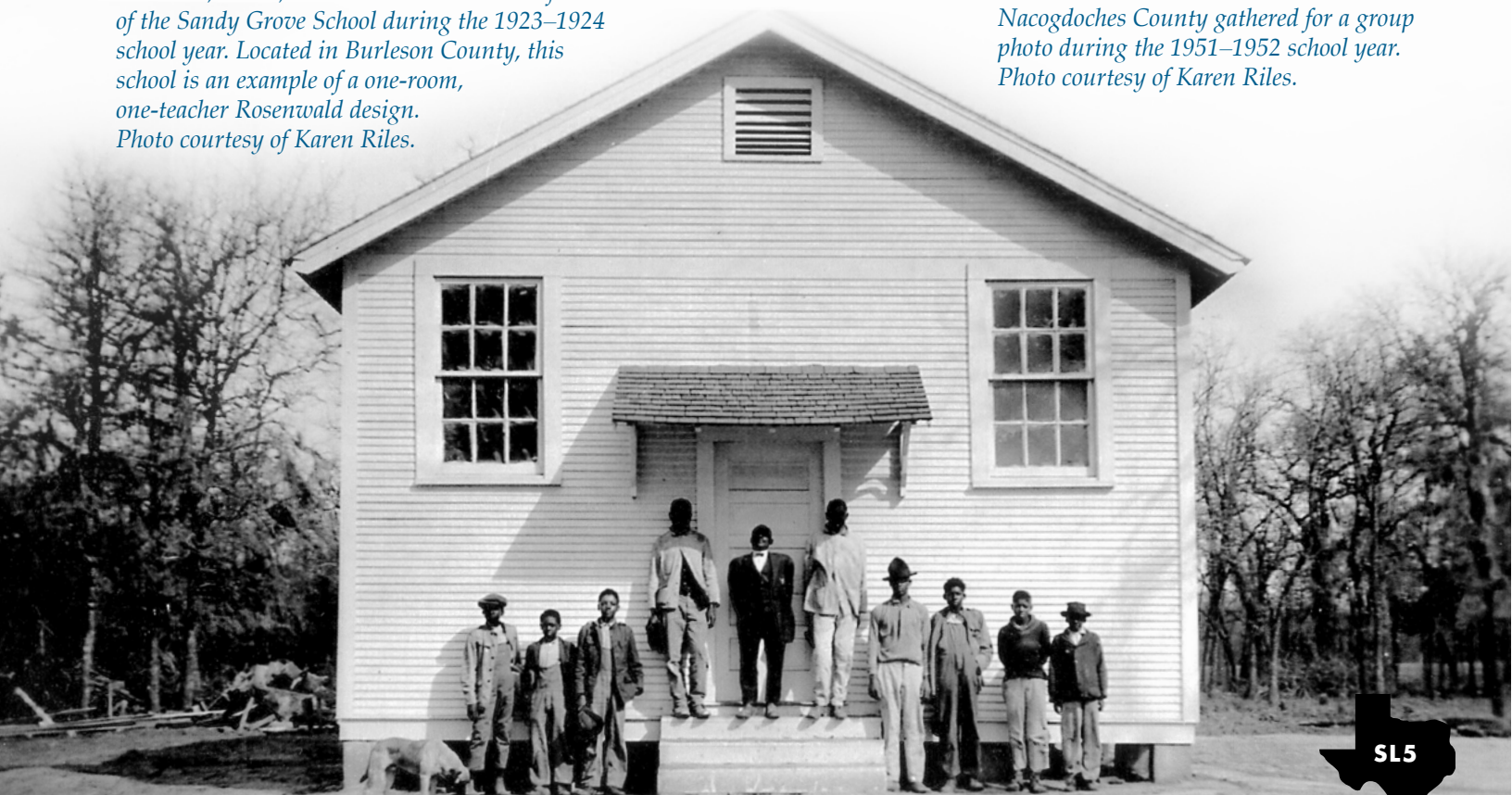
INSTRUCTIONAL SUGGESTIONS
