#### INSTRUCTIONAL SUGGESTIONS

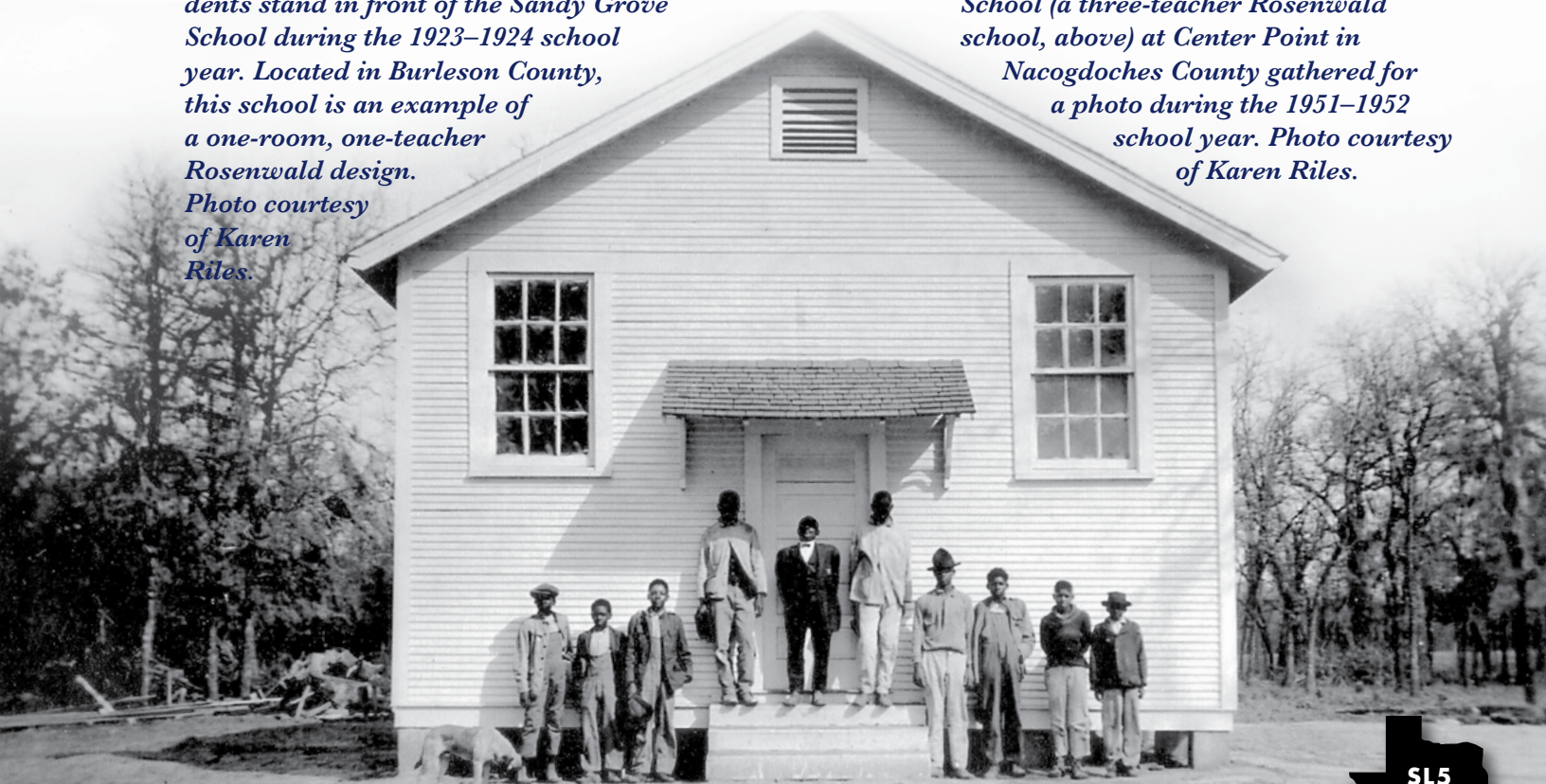
